Classic Motorcycles: The Art of Speed is a great ride through motorcycle history, with gorgeous photos of foreign and domestic bikes and bike specs. When Ducati's great engineer Fabio Taglioni designed the 750 Ducati in 1970 there was no way he could comprehend how important this model would be. His design was unlike any other before or since: a 90-degree V-twin with single overhead camshafts driven by a train of bevel gears. Taglioni soon developed his 750 into a Formula 750 racer, and in 1972 beat the rest of what the world had to offer at the Imola 200. With this victory, the desmodromic 750 became a legend. Ducati responded by producing a hand-built limited production desmodromic Super Sport. They also continued to produce the touring 750 GT and sporting 750 Sport until legislation killed them at the end of 1974. Today, this triumvirate of 750s represents the end of an era; the era before cost accounting and government design requirements. These were amongst the last pure, unadulterated sporting motorcycles built and it is not surprising they have inspired a

new generation of retro classics, the Sport Classic of 2005 and 2006. Author Ian Falloon is a Ducati expert with several books on the marque including the best-selling The Ducati Story, and Ducati Twins Restoration Guide. He has owned several 750s over the years and has a particular enthusiasm for this model, still owning the 750 Super Sport he bought back in the 1970s. Turn signal and kick stand status functions are implemented by software polling of external switches. The system incorporates a small keyboard for input of a five digit security code. If the code input is correct, ignition is enabled and normal operation may follow. If the code input is incorrect, ignition is disabled, and the motorcycle horn is

activated as an alarm. The operator is allowed two attempts at entrance of the five digit code. All system functions are displayed via various configurations of 7-segment and discrete LED displays for operator feedback. The system utilizes the twelve volt motorcycle power source and is contained on three double sided circuit boards. The system software was developed on the INTEL SDK85 system design prototype kit and transferred in final form to an on-board EPROM."--Abstract.
